

REMARKS:

- Accidentals only concern the note before which they are placed, except repeated notes.
- The bass flute must be amplified (stereo configuration), amplification can be made with two high quality condensed microphones: one for the ordinary sounds, other for the percussion keys.
- Depending on the acoustics of the concert hall, the bass-flute can be reverberated slightly with a high quality reverb (e.g. Lexicon PCM81.)
- The electro-acoustic diffusion system must be quadraphonic; for the channels disposition please see the diagram included in the next page. A metronome beat is played in an independent channel (channel 5 in the Max patch), it can be sent to the headphones of the flute player.
- Events *zero* and *one* can be triggered by the player using a midi pedal, otherwise it must be manually triggered using the space bar of the computer (see the video instructions included in the CD-ROM). In the Max collective patch the event "one" triggers the electronic part (tape) whereas event "0" stops all.
- Duration: 10 minutes and 06 seconds.







