John McGuire, tenor Vlatka Peljhan, violin Mia Elezović, piano



Vlatka Peljhan is an accomplished violinist and violist, whose career spans a rich tapestry of solo, chamber, and orchestral performances. She began her musical journey at the Academy of Music in Zagreb, Croatia, before further honing her craft with dual Master's degrees in violin and viola from the Hogeschool voor Muziek en Dans in the Netherlands. Her teachers include Rotterdam. distinguished educators such as Jean-Jacques Kantorow, Cristian Bor, Andras Czifra, Eva Hühn, Asja Kushner, and Giselle Bergman. As a soloist, she has appeared with numerous Croatian orchestras, including the Zagreb Philharmonic, the Croatian Army Symphony Orchestra, Symphony Orchestra of the National Opera House, and the Academy of Music Wind Orchestra. She gained international recognition early in her career by winning the prestigious "A. Marcosig" International Violin Competition in Italy in 1998.

A sought-after chamber musician, Vlatka Peljhan has collaborated with many ensembles, notably as a member of the award-winning Zagreb Piano Trio. With this ensemble,

she captivated audiences at both national and international chamber music festivals, performing in Israel, Norway, Germany, Austria, Slovenia, Italy, and the Netherlands. She is also a co-founder of the Alisios Camerata chamber ensemble, with whom she has toured extensively in Japan, Canada, Poland, and Cyprus. Their CD, featuring works by Croatian composers dedicated to Alisios Camerata, has been widely acclaimed. Her versatility extends to contemporary music as a member of the International Contemporary Music Ensemble, Synchronos, and her passion for baroque music has led her to join renowned baroque groups such as Harmonia Antiqua Labacensis and the Balkan Baroque Band, performing across Greece, Slovenia, Italy, and France. Her extensive orchestral experience includes performances with the Pacific Music Festival Orchestra in Japan, the Symphony Orchestra Academy of the Pacific in Canada, the Rotterdam Chamber Orchestra, and the Amsterdam Symphony Orchestra. She was also a member of Symphony Orchestra of the famed Arena di Verona Foundation during the summer of 2014. Most recently, she was a leader of the Friuli Venezia Giulia Orchestra in Italy.



Elezovic has performed Mia internationally in solo recitals and chamber music concerts across Europe, Asia, and North and Middle America. She has appeared a soloist with renowned orchestras, including the Croatian Symphony Radio Orchestra, Zagreb Philharmonic Orchestra, Dubrovnik Symphony Orchestra, Chamber Histoire Orchestra and (Brooklyn) more under conductors Kazushi Ono, Pavle Despalj, Pascal Ralphe, Andreja Šolar, Tara Simoncic, Aleksandar Kalajdžić and Luca Pfaff. Ms. Elezovic has made

recordings for labels such as Croatian Radio, MSR Classics, Aulos, Cantus Edition, and Bella Musica Edition. In addition, she has appeared with notable success on radio and television in Austria, Croatia, Germany and France. She leads a very active musical life participating in various festivals as Hamamatsu Music Academy, Schleswig-Holstein Musik Festival, Holland Music Session, Music Biennale Zagreb,

Dubrovnik Summer Festival, Las Vegas Music Festival, and participated in projects in chamber music at Jeunesses Musicales Croatia. Ms. Elezovic was a pianist at the Spanish National Ensemble for Contemporary Music in Madrid.

She is a founding member of Alisios Camerata as well as Synchronos Ensemble- for contemporary music. Her expertise in contemporary music led her to collaborate with different ensembles such as Zagreb Guitar Trio, East Coast Contemporary Ensemble, USA; Le Train Blue, USA, Cantus Ensemble, Croatia. Ms. Elezovic has collaborated with esteemed international artists and composers. In 2013 one of the leading contemporary Croatian composers, dr. Davorin Kempf wrote a piano concerto and insisted Ms. Elezovic to premiere it with Zagreb Philharmonic Orchestra.

Ms. Elezovic has won prizes at prestigious national and international competitions, including 1st prize at the prestige the Darko Lukic Music Competition, in Zagreb, Croatia (at the same time the award from Croatian Composers Society), and First Prize in Moncalieri, Italy; the Third Prize at the International Piano Competition in Rome, Italy. She was finalist at the International Piano Competition in Kobe, Japan as semifinalist at the "Seiler Piano Competition" in Kitzingen, Germany.

Ms. Elezovic received the Rector Prize at the University of Zagreb, Croatia, Da-Ponte Foundation Award in Germany, and scholarships from organizations like Rom-Foundation, Soros Foundation and Rotary Club Germany. In 2019, she received the Dean Prize at the Academy for Arts and Culture in Osijek for artistic and pedagogical contributions. Since 2012, Ms. Elezovic has been a vocal coach and the managing director of the Franco-American Vocal Academy in Salzburg, Austria. She was also invited to coach singers at Scuola Italia's Summer Program for Young Opera Singers in Sant'Angelo in Vado, Italy. Ms. Elezovic was part of the vocal accompanying department at Manhattan School of Music, NYC, where she played for vocal studios of Mark Oswald, Gait Sirguey, Marianne Barrett, Joan Caplan and Mignon Dunn. In addition, she was a pianist at the master classes of Mo Manfred Mayrhofer, William Matteuzzi, William Lewis, Sylvia Stone, Silvia dalla Benetta as well as played for lessons at Mrs Ruza Pospis Baldani's studio.

Besides performing Ms.Elezovic continuously stays in the pedagogical path. She has held faculty positions at various institutions worldwide, including the International School Frankfurt (Germany), Kyoto University for Music and Art (Japan), British School Tokyo (Japan), Bergen Academy of Music (USA), Arts Academy at the University of Split (Croatia), and Royal Conservatory of Liege (Belgium) and since 2016 Ms. Elezovic teaches at the Academy of Arts and Culture, University J.J.Strossmayer in Osijek, Croatia. She has been invited to give master classes at different festivals and summer camps in Europe and the USA. Between 2019-2021 Ms Elezovic was the Head of the Instrumental Department at the Academy of Arts and Culture in Osijek.

Born in Zagreb, Croatia, Ms.Elezovic began her musical education at Zagreb in the class Zvjezdana Basic. After graduating, at age of 19, she moved to Vienna to study at the Hochschule für Musik in Wien and later to Frankfurt/Main for "Aufbaustudium" with Herbert Seidel. Parallel she was a student of the master's program at Music Academy in Zagreb, where she received her Master of Music degree in 2001 from the Music Academy in Zagreb. She moved to New York City in 2007 for the Contemporary Performance Program at Manhattan School of Music, where she received her second master's degree in 2009.

In 2004, she was invited by the Japanese government for a 10-month research program in the field of Japanese contemporary music for piano at Showa Music Academy in Japan. Ms. Elezovic had the opportunity to collaborate with several distinguished professors who left their mark on her musical journey such as R. Kehrer, J. F. Antonioli, L. Hokanson, J. O'Conor and M. Guindani, which contributed to shaping her artistic personality and expertise. Mia Elezovic's multifaceted career reflects her dedication to both performance and education, showcasing her versatility as a pianist, vocal coach, and educator in various cultural and musical contexts. Currently, Vlatka Peljhan serves as the Concertmaster of the National Opera Orchestra in Zagreb and is an esteemed Associate Professor of Chamber Music at the Academy of Music in Zagreb.



Dr. John A. McGuire is an active teacher, director and performer. Dr. McGuire is a member the music faculty at Christopher Newport University (CNU) as an Associate Professor of Voice and the Director of OperaCNU. Operas he has directed for OperaCNU include The Old and the Thief, Così fan tutte. Die Fledermaus, The Whole Truth, Gianni Schicchi, The Pirates of Penzance, The Tender Land, Brundibár, the world premiere production of The Trial of God, The Magic Flute and Le nozze di Figaro. John has performed with several opera companies and orchestras throughout the United States and Europe. Most recently he performed the role of Emperor Altoum in Virginia Opera's production of Turandot. Some of his other leading operatic roles include Tamino, Die Zauberflöte, Idomeneo, Idomeneo, Sultan, Zaide, Pedrillo, The Abduction from the Seraglio, Lippo, Street Scene, Martin, The Tender Land, Ferrando, Così fan tutte, Don José, Carmen, and Rodolfo, La bohème. Dr. McGuire has served a member of CNU's Torggler Summer Vocal Institute faculty where he conducted Master Classes, Private Lessons, presented Opera Workshop seminars, and directed Opera Scenes. As a faculty member for the William Lewis School of Opera he is an Opera Director and a Professor of Applied Voice. He has directed productions for both the Franco American Vocal Academy and The Austrian American Mozart Academy. These directing credits include, Les Contes D'Hoffmann, La Périchole, La belle Hélène, Leçons de Français Au Étudiants Américains,

Der Shauspieldirektor, Bastien un Bastienne, and Le Nozze di Figaro. Dr. McGuire's students have gone on to perform with several prestigious opera companies including San Francisco Opera, Houston Grand Opera, Chicago Lyric Opera, Santa Fe Opera, and Boston Lyric Opera.

Music Program
